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# COVID-19 UPDATE

## \*\*\* Easing of COVID-19 Restrictions – Re-Opening Plan \*\*\*

The Government of Ontario announced that the province wide COVID-19 related stay-at-home order will begin a **three-stage** gradual lifting starting **June 11, 2021**.

*“As we begin to enjoy the benefits of the first step in our roadmap like meeting friends or visiting your favourite local store, please do so safely by continuing to follow all public health guidelines,”* Premier Doug Ford said in a statement.

While the stay-at-home order ended on June 2, 2021, we must all continue to follow the public health and workplace safety measures and restrictions.

For **residential housing communities**, permitted activities during **Stage 1** of the re-opening plan, which focuses on outdoor activities, include:

✓ **Outdoor gatherings of up to 10 people**

Each Stage is expected to last for 21 days. **Indoor activities and events** are expected to be permitted during **Stage 3** of the re-opening plan if public health indicators are achieved.

## COVID-19 Preventative Measures for Residents

To help stop the spread of COVID-19, to protect residents and employees, and to comply with public health safety measures, the following preventative steps will still be in place:

- 1) **The Management Office will continue to be CLOSED for resident and public access until further notice.**
- 2) Staff will respond to phone, written, or email communications during scheduled work hours.
- 3) Only emergency and essential maintenance work within units will be carried out during **Stage 1**. Maintenance requests must be submitted using the approved work order form together with screening questionnaire.
- 4) Having anyone, including family or friends, that is not a member of your household in your home for a social visit is discouraged by public health officials (essential support workers and emergency repair persons are permitted).
- 5) Individuals who live alone may have exclusive contact with only one other household to help reduce the negative impacts of social isolation.
- 6) In person meetings or indoor common area gatherings are not permitted.

All residents and staff are expected to fully support the public health measures to prevent a COVID-19 outbreak and to protect our collective health, safety, and well-being.
